

County of Shirley Madame : Made the 19<sup>th</sup> Day of June in the year of our Lord  
1791 one Thousand seven Hundred and Sixty ~~two~~ two Robert Meopes Green of St. Mary's  
Parish in the County of Outpeper Gent in the Colony of Virginia and Mary his  
wife of the one part and James Williams of the Parish of Dorchester in the County  
and Colony of Virginia Shander of the other part Witnesseth that the  
Meopes Green ~~and his wife~~ for and in consideration of the Sum of Forty three  
Pounds Eighteen Shillings and Six pence Curr<sup>t</sup> Money of Virginia to them  
in hand paid by the said James Williams before the Ensigning and  
Delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof the said Meopes Green & Mary  
his wife do hereby Acknowledge and the said James Williams his heirs  
Exors and Admors of and therefrom and of and from every part and  
Part thereof Do forever Exonerate and Discharge by these presents Have  
given granted Bargained sold conveyed and confirmed and by these presents  
Do give grant Bargain sell convey and confirm to the said James  
Williams his heirs and assigns forever a certain Dividend Tract or  
Parcel of Land containing by Estimation Seventy Six Acres Situate  
lying and being in the County of Virginia and being a part of a Greater Tract  
Formerly granted to Robert Green Gent De farther the said Meopes party hereto  
and by the said Robert in his last will and Testament amongst other things  
Bequeathed the said Land to be Divided between his two sons James & Meopes Green  
and lying in the fork of the Shorrons River and is bounded as follows  
Beginning at Two Red oaks Hickory and Pine corner to that Land the said  
Williams formerly bought of M<sup>r</sup> Mees Green on the north side Shorrons River

And running up the several houses thereof North Eighty five Degrees and  
thirty two pole north thirty . . . west & sixteen pole . . . West forty four pole to  
Cecilingtons Stone on the Road leading to Strobbos & thence thence north forty five  
Degrees west ten pole to a poplar white oak and pine on the East side as  
Drane's thence up the said Drane's North thirty two Degrees East sixty one pole  
to three Red oaks on the side a Ridge and on the North side the Church Road  
& thence up the said Road South Sixty Degrees East forty eight poles to a  
box oak and white oak on a Bridge thence South Eighty four Degrees East  
one hundred and seventy four poles to two red oaks and hickory on a hill  
side in Williams Stone thence with his line North Sixty five Degrees East  
one hundred and seventy pole to the beginning of the fourth with ball and  
Singular the said ~~beginning~~ <sup>beginning</sup> of the fourth with ball and  
ways Gascones his Moors his woods his water his woods his  
Underwoods Timbers Profits Commodities hereditaments and Appurtenances  
Whosoever to the same belonging or in any wise <sup>Reversions</sup> ~~being~~ <sup>being</sup> and the  
Reversion and Remainder and Remainders Residue Profits and profits of the  
Premises and all the Estate Right Title Interest Property Claim Demand  
whatsoever of the said Moors Green and Mary his wife or either of them or of  
or to the said premises with the Appurtenances and every part and parcel  
thereof to have and to hold the said land and premises with their and every  
of their Appurtenances unto the said James Williams his heirs and assigns forever  
To the only proper use and behoof of the said James Williams his heirs and  
assigns forever and to no other use Intend or purpose whatsoever and the said  
Moors Green for himself his heirs Executors and Admors both covenants promise  
and agree to and with the said James Williams his heirs and assigns by their  
presents in manner and form following (that is to say) that they the said  
Moors Green and Mary his wife immediately at and before the Enacting  
of these presents were or one of them was seized of in the said land and premises  
with the Appurtenances and every part and parcel thereof of a good firm  
Absolute and Inalienable Right of Inheritance in Fee Simple and had  
good Right Title and Authority to convey the said premises with the  
Appurtenances in such manner and form as by these presents the said  
premises are conveyed that the said Moors Green and Mary his wife for  
themselves



Themselves and their heirs the said Premises with the Appurtenances to  
 said James Williams his heirs and assigns and them the said Moses Green  
 Mary his wife their heirs and assigns and all other persons whatsoever she  
 and will warrant and forever Defend by these presents that the said James  
 Williams his heirs and assigns shall and have from time to time and all  
 Times forever hereafter Have hold use occupy possess and Enjoy the said  
 Premises with the Appurtenances without the let Disturbance hindera-  
 or Molestation of them the said Moses Green Mary his wife their or either  
 of their heirs or assigns or any other person or persons whatsoever lawfully  
 Claiming the said premises or any part or parts thereof In Witness whereof  
 the said Moses Green and Mary his wife have hereunto set their hand  
 and seals the Day and Year first above written —
